

INTERNATIONAL CONCRETE REPAIR INSTITUTE BALTIMORE WASHINGTON CHAPTER CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION 2025 (ACADEMIC)

Each scholarship granted under this program may be up to \$1,000.00, plus a one-year individual membership in the National ICRI and the Baltimore Washington Chapter of ICRI. The award shall be for one year, and applicants may reapply in subsequent years. The Scholarship Award may be used towards an accredited institution of higher learning, professional certification program or a continuing educational program. All winners will have to submit an accountability of the Scholarship Award.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for the ICRI-BWC Scholarship Award, you must be currently enrolled, have substantially completed, or will complete at least two (2) years of study at an accredited two (2) or four (4) year college, university, or vocational-technical school. Although not a requirement, students who focus their study in the field of concrete design, concrete repair, engineering (Civil or Structural), or construction management may be given preference in awarding the scholarships.

To receive consideration for the Scholarship Award, the student must currently be attending class within the boundaries of the ICRI Baltimore-Washington Chapter (including Northern Virginia, District of Columbia or Maryland) or have a relative, as defined below, as a current Chapter member.

The following outlines the requirements and precedence given for consideration of the awards by the Scholarship Committee:

<u>Primary Application Priority</u>: Applicants in the studies relevant to the field of concrete design, concrete repair, engineering (Civil or Structural), construction management, or related field.

- 1. Applicants currently attending classes within the <u>boundaries</u> of the ICRI Baltimore-Washington Chapter (including Northern Virginia, District of Columbia or Maryland). Applicants are not required to have a relative as a current Chapter member.
- 2. Applicants must be currently attending class within the <u>boundaries</u> of the ICRI Baltimore-Washington Chapter (including Northern Virginia, District of Columbia or Maryland). The applicant must be an employee (full-time, part-time), or have an employment/internship history with an ICRI-BWC Member Company. Applicants are not required to have a relative as a current Chapter member.
- 3. Applicants NOT currently attending class within the boundaries of the ICRI Baltimore-Washington Chapter (including Northern Virginia, District of Columbia or Maryland). Applicants are required to have a relative as a current Chapter member as defined below.

<u>Secondary Application Priority</u>: Applicants that are <u>not</u> in the studies of concrete design, concrete repair, engineering (Civil or Structural), or construction management, BUT have a parent or close relative as a current Chapter member as defined below.

*Definition of Relative: Applicants who have a relative as a current Chapter member as defined by the following: the Chapter member is the applicant's spouse, parent (including foster, adoption and stepparent), grandparent, great-grandparent, or legal guardian

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

Members of the scholarship committee will evaluate all applicants by order of precedence and provide the Board of Directors with their selections. The Board of Directors will provide final approval.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Selection will be made by the Scholarship Committee based on merit, scholarship, goals, involvement with ICRI-BWC Chapter, extracurricular achievement, character, meritorious service and application criteria such as transcripts, recommendations, etc. The Application Priorities listed in the Eligibility section above will also be taken into consideration. The Scholarship Committee will notify the recipient by **October 20, 2025.** All applicants will be notified of the final selections at that time.

The applicant will have to submit:

- 1. The scholarship application
- 2. A current transcript (if applicable).
- 3. Three letter(s) of recommendation.

PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP

A check will be made payable to the institution the scholarship recipient is attending, only after recipient completes registration. The award may go directly to the recipient with proof of registration and receipt of payment to the institution.

Recipients may be eligible to re-apply for scholarships in future years, conditional upon satisfactory progress toward completion of the degree requirements, and the availability of scholarship funds: however, a new application form with updated transcripts must be submitted in order to be considered.

RESPONSIBILITY OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

- 1. Scholarship recipient must enroll in a college or university, professional certification program or continuing educational program in the fall of the year in which scholarships are awarded, and continue in that institution or program that entire academic year or until the program is completed without interruption, barring illness or emergencies.
- 2. The recipient should maintain satisfactory progress toward completion of the degree requirements.
- 3. A recipient who leaves the institution or program and does not complete the course of study during the period for which he or she has received a scholarship may be required to return the award.
- 4. A recipient may be required to participate in the annual meeting of the association by reporting on his or her academic progress. Recipients must also agree to participate in any follow-up studies conducted by the association.
- 5. Recipient must respond within 30 days of award to receive it.
- 6. Scholarship recipient will be invited to attend the 4th quarter ICRI dinner meeting.
